A cancer diagnosis can affect many aspects of your life, especially your finances. This folder contains information on financial help programs and resources so you can live better with cancer.



Insurance

MEDICAL OR DISABILITY INSURANCE

Your credit card company can offer you medical or disability insurance. Check with your credit card company or with your financial institution.

A reimbursement of your payments for a mortgage or car loan may be available. Check with your financial institution.

PRIVATE OR GROUP INSURANCE

Speak to your insurer or employer to find out if you have salary insurance.

CRITICAL ILLNESS INSURANCE

Speak to your insurer or employer to find out if you have critical illness insurance

Medications

Many medications can be reimbursed through an insurance policy. Speak to your pharmacist or insurer (private or group) to learn more about available programs.

Last-resort financial assistance



SOCIAL SOLIDARITY PROGRAM (aka «social assistance»)

This program provides financial assistance to persons who have no income and who have a severely limited capacity for employment (e.g., due to a medical condition). Their limited capacity is supported by a medical report.

To benefit from last-resort financial assistance, you must fill out a request form that is available online or at your local employment centre (CLE).
