

### PLANNING YOUR RADIATION ONCOLOGY TREATMENTS

### YOUR FIRST APPOINTMENT

The first appointment is to plan your radiation oncology treatments. We will carry out the following examinations:

#### Transaxial tomography (CAT scan)

We will first determine your treatment position. Accessories can be made to make you comfortable and make it easier to repeat the position.

Next we will take the specific radiographic images (the scan). These images will allow the radio-oncologist to determine the exact location for administering the treatments.

The exact place where the treatments will be administered will be marked on your body (permanent tattoos, depending on the situation). These marks will allow us to return to the same position for your next appointments.

#### Time between your first appointment and the beginning of your treatments

This delay is to allow us to digitally analyse the distribution dose for your body to obtain the best possible treatment.



### PREPARATION FOR YOUR FIRST APPOINTMENT

WE	ask you to follow the directions thethed below.
	No specific recommendation
	Fasting
	You must not eat for at least 3 hours before the exam, but you are allowed to drink water.
	Emptying your bladder
	You must urinate just before your exam.
	Enema (to clear the rectum)
	You must have an enema 2 hours before the examination. Use a Fleet enema which is available from your pharmacy and follow the instructions.
	Filling the bladder
	The day before your first appointment, drink 1 litre of water, spread over 12 hours. You may urinate when you want to.
	On the day of your first meeting, urinate one (1) hour before your treatment, then drink a total of 500 ml of water (approximately two [2] glasses) within the next thirty (30) minutes and do not urinate until your examination.

It is extremely important for you to follow these directions so we are best able to plan your treatment. If, for any reason, you were unable to follow these specific directions for your examination, it is important to tell the technologist when you arrive at your appointment.

- dark coloured clothing; the ink used to make the marks on your skin could stain your clothing.
